

#### Report on International Day for Biological Diversity 2023 Organized by Dept of Zoology, KCC

The students and teachers of 138 No. Kashinath Vidyamandir LP School, Rupiabathan, Nalbari were invited to participate in the event of Lecture cum Laboratory visit. The program commenced at 11:30 am with the welcome address given by Darathi Deori, Asst Professor, Dept of Zoology. The respected dignitaries: Kishore Kumar Talukdar (head teacher), Mamoni Devi (assistant teacher), and Dr. Sujan Kalita, Secretary of Science Forum (Asst Professor, Dept of Chemistry) were felicitated followed by a talk on biodiversity and the need for its conservation by Nipu Kumar Das, Asst Professor, Dept of Zoology. 







#### CODE OF ETHICS

In order to inculcate a sense of discipline and values among the students, teachers and staff of the college, Kamrup College, Chamata has decided to adopt the Code of Ethics as detailed below. All the teachers, students and non-teaching staff of the college are expected to adhere to the code of conduct in order to fulfil the expectations of all the stakeholders.

#### Code of Conduct for Students

#### Code of Conduct for Teachers


#### Teachers should:

Teachers should:


- Treat other members of the profession in the same manner as they expect others to treat themselves.

- All staff members should deal with the students and colleagues with due politeness and sense of co-operation







Name: Celebration cum Observance of National Voters' Day


Date and Place: 25th January, 2021 at College ground

# 2. Sanskrit Diwas on 22 august, 2021 for peace and communal harmony


